
In 2021 our JDL Northwest Club re-opened after three years and we opened our new South End Club.

Carl is the only boy of 5 kids in his family. When he started at the Club, he was shy, reserved, and introverted. The Club became a second home, an oasis from the chaos in his neighborhood and school, and most importantly, his happy place where he could be

In 2021, Carl became Youth of the Year. This opportunity allowed him to be an advocate for all of the members of Boys & Girls Clubs of Hartford, sharing his story and the impact the Club had with him. He attributes the Club to helping him find and use his voice; because of this, he wants to encourage other youth, who look like him to find and use theirs voices.

### A CLUB MEMBER THROUGH THE YEARS

Boys & Girls Clubs of Hartford offers numerous life opportunities each year for members between the ages of 3 and 18.

Below is an illustration of the breadth and depth of BGCH programming during these developmental years.

#### **AGE 3-5**

Sophie is excited to start school at the Early Learning Center, where they provide a learning environment that nurtures and supports Pre-K students in a holistic approach. Sophie enjoys all the hands-on science activities and reading.

#### AGE 6

Sophie is now old enough to become a Club member! Sophie's mom is thankful to have all her kids enrolled at the clubs as she has come to rely on the Club as a safe place for her kids to go after school while she works. On Sophie's first day, she went straight to the Art Room.

### AGE 7

Sophie is thrilled to start the new school year and being at the Club after enjoying the summer months at the Summer Fun Camp. She has met so many friends at the Clubs, which is essential because her older sister, who is going to college, will not be around. Her mom is grateful for the meals and snacks served daily.

#### AGE 8

Sophie is thrilled to be able to spend time in the Makerspace Room. She enjoys using the computers, the Clubs 3D printer, and designing her own t-shirt. She enjoys learning about coding and robotics.

#### AGE 9

Sophie loves being healthy and active at the Club. She is learning about nutrition and how to cook through Health and Wellness. Sophie is working on her soccer skills in the Clubs ALL STARS sports program.

#### **AGE 10**

Sophie dedicates the beginning of each afternoon to completing her homework during Power Hour in the education room. If she struggles with a topic, the staff are there to help her work through complicated assignments. Sophie often stays late for STEAM to learn about science, technology, engineering, arts and math.

#### **AGE 11**

Sophie joins the Torch Club. As a member, she works with her peers on several service projects, group activities, and leadership opportunities. The staff help Sophie develop life skills, build strong character, and appreciate community importance, especially now that she is in a new school.

#### **AGE 12**

Sophie had many questions about Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion so she joined the Youth for Unity program. The program consists of a comprehensive, broadbased set of activities and conversation starters to help members appreciate themselves as unique and special individuals. Members are also taught about our society's diversity, how to recognize bias and unfairness, and take personal leadership in confronting discrimination.

### **AGE 13**

Sophie is learning about financial literacy through the Club's Money Matters program. She is learning how to manage a checking account, create a budget, save and invest, start a small business, and pay for college. Members who complete Money Matters show improved financial management skills, including saving money and sticking to a budget.

#### **AGE 14**

Now that Sophie is 14, she can join the Keystone Club. This unique program provides teens with leadership development opportunities activities, both in and out of the Club, in three focus areas: Academic Success, Career Preparation, and Community Service. She wants to create a program for the Clubs that can help with food insecurity as her project.

#### **AGE 15**

Sophie has been working with the staff in the Workforce Readiness program on preparing her resume and learning skills for a successful job interview. She is very excited to put these skills to good use when preparing to be a Junior Staff this summer.



#### **AGE 16**

Sophie is working really hard to get badges in the SMART Girls program. SMART Girls has different sessions with healthy decision making, positive self-concept and positive peer relations. She hopes to win the START Girls competition and speak at the Dashaway Luncheon.



#### **AGE 17**

Sophie attends weekly Workforce Readiness meetings, where staff help her create a plan to apply to colleges and complete financial aid forms. Jaden utilized the Career Launch program to assess her skills and interests, explore careers, make sound educational decisions, and prepare to join the workforce while getting ready to go to college.

#### **AGE 18**

Sophie is excited to represent the Club in the Youth of the Year competition. She will be interviewed along with other candidates from other Clubs in Hartford, where she will share her story of how the Clubs enriched her childhood. If she wins, she will go on to the regional competition, with a chance to get to the national competition! Sophie is heading to college in the fall and she can't wait to visit the Club as an Alumnus over break.

## **PROGRAM FOCUS AREAS**

### **ACADEMIC SUCCESS**

Through our Academic Success programs we are developing globally competitive graduates. These programs are designed to ensure that all Club members graduate from high school on time, ready for a post-secondary education and a 21st Century career.

#### **HEALTH & WELLNESS**

Through our Health & Wellness programs our members find support and tools to help with social & emotional trauma. These programs develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors to nurture their well-being, set personal goals and grow into self-sufficient adults.

#### CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP

Through our Character & Leadership programs we are helping youth become responsible, caring citizens and acquire skills to participate in the democratic process. Our Club members also develop leadership skills and gain opportunities for planning, decision-making, contributing to the Clubs and the community.

# STEAM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math

Through our STEAM programs the Boys & Girls Clubs are committed to closing the opportunity gap in science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics with innovative and creative programs and activities for our Club members. After-school and summer learning environments provide unique opportunities to advance STEAM knowledge and increase interest in STEAM-related careers.

## **DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION**

Through our Diversity, Equity & Inclusion programs we are removing barriers to opportunity and advancement, so that we can continue to move towards racial equity by shaping a robust dialogue among Club leaders, staff, board volunteers, and young people. These specialized initiatives provide Club staff with training and resources to ensure young people who are frequently marginalized or overlooked can be included and supported at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Hartford.

### **WORKFORCE READINESS**

Through our Workforce Readiness programs we are empowering young people to succeed. To help young people meet the workforce challenges of tomorrow, they need safe spaces, positive mentorship and work experiences. At Boys & Girls Clubs, we allow kids and teens to explore their interests and passions, develop their employability skill, and apply their knowledge to real world work experiences.
