From a very young age, many kids have to deal with some very adult stuff. Violence, food insecurity, poverty, anxiety -- just to name a few.







- Money Matters: promotes financial independence through budgeting & saving.



Academic Success



ACADEMIC SUCCESS

We are developing globally competitive graduates with the skills, knowledge and training they need to pursue their goals and interests. Our programs are designed to ensure that all Club Members graduate from high school on time and ready for post-secondary education or the workforce.

What We Do

Power Hour is a homework-help program which encourages Club Members to become self-directed learners. Power Hour stresses daily homework completion while offering academic support and tutoring.

Project Learn is a comprehensive academic success strategy that cultivates a love of learning through positive environment, academic support and high-yield activities. Research has shown that kids do better in school when they spend their non-school hours engaged in learning activities such as leisure reading, writing and games that develop their cognitive skills.

Ultimate Journey engages youth, ages 9 to 13, in fun, experiential environmental education. The program cultivates awareness and appreciation for the natural world, including ecological stewardship and outdoor activities.

Summer Brain Gain is a program for all ages dedicated to expanding learning opportunities during the “out-of-school” summer months to prevent Members from falling behind the learning curve.



Character & Leadership



**CHARACTER &
LEADERSHIP**

We help youth become responsible, caring citizens with the skills necessary to participate in the democratic process. Club Members develop leadership skills and gain opportunities to plan, make decisions and contribute to our Clubs and community. We inspire our members, give them the confidence to make meaningful change in their communities, develop a sense of civic responsibility and prepare them for the future.

What We Do

Keystone Club is a dynamic program for teens, ages 14 to 18, that provides valuable leadership and service experiences. Teens participate in activities in three focus areas: academic success, career exploration and community service. Members elect officers and engage in a broad spectrum of activities.

Torch Club is a leadership and service club for ages 11 to 13. Members learn to elect officers and work together to implement activities in the following four areas: service to the Clubs and community, education, health and fitness, and social recreation. Each year Torch Club members from across the country take part in a service-learning experience through the National Torch Project.

Youth of the Year is a leadership development program for teens ages 14 to 18. It includes hands-on activities that explore topics such as identity, passion, personal branding, voice, teamwork and goal setting. The program prepares teens for the signature Youth of the Year award process.


Junior Youth of the Year is designed for ages 10 to 13 and prepares youth to respond to the growing demand for 21st century leadership skills. The program offers training and practice for youth who are developing their leadership abilities and offers one youth the opportunity to be a Club ambassador for the year.

UPS Road Code is a global program that teaches safe driving techniques to teens and helps them “drive change” in their communities. The program focuses on different safety principles, from basic instruction to the consequences of risky behaviors behind the wheel, such as texting and talking on the phone or drinking while driving. Each participant is awarded a UPS Road Code Safe Driving for Teens certificate at the conclusion of the program.

Million Members Million Hours of Service encourages good character in youth and an appreciation for citizenship. It offers every Club Member the opportunity for year-round volunteer activities. The program exposes Members to the world of possibility around them and empowers them to make a difference in their community.

OJJDP implements gang-prevention programs designed to encourage youth to resist the culture of social cruelty, stand up to bullying and reject gang violence. Members learn personal values and skills, cultural competence, peaceful conflict resolution and a positive sense of self.

Diversity, Equity & Inclusion



**DIVERSITY, EQUALITY
& INCLUSION**

Diversity, Equity & Inclusion programs are removing barriers and creating opportunity and advancement. Through a robust dialogue with Club leaders, staff, board members, volunteers, and youth we can continue to move toward racial equity. Club staff are provided with specialized training and resources to ensure young people who are frequently marginalized or overlooked can be included and supported.

What We Do

Youth for Unity engages members and parents in activities that promote diversity and combat prejudice, bigotry and discrimination. It consists of a comprehensive, broad-based set of programmatic interventions that build the capacity to help our Club members appreciate themselves as unique and special individuals, understand our society's diversity, recognize bias and unfairness and take personal leadership in confronting discrimination.

LGBTQ Initiative increases the Clubs capacity to provide a safe, positive and inclusive environment for youth, teens, staff and families of all sexual orientations, gender identities and gender expressions. We aim to create a culture of shared understanding of gender and sexuality, highlighted through inclusive language and practices that increase social and emotional safety for all young people.

Be There is a comprehensive approach to helping youth build supportive relationships and integrate best practices. We help our youth process their grief and provide resilience development as part of a long-term approach in preparing them to reach their full potential. BGCH provides training, resources and strategies to meet a variety of youth, family, staff and community needs.

Disability Inclusion creates a safe, positive and inclusive environment for all youth. We support youth with different abilities and stress inclusion to improve the experiences of all youth.

Cultural & Inclusive Events BGCH provides training for Youth Development Professionals to support an inclusive and culturally responsive environment when interacting with youth and their families. We seek to find opportunities to collectively create equity for everyone. BGCH is committed to creating a culture of belonging where staff and youth are free from explicit and implicit bias, prejudice, and discrimination.



Health & Wellness



HEALTH & WELLNESS

Our Health & Wellness programs develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors to nurture their well-being, set personal goals and grow into self-sufficient adults. We do this by providing safe places for members to practice healthy decision making, participate in physical activities, and engage in programming designed to promote social-emotional wellbeing.

What We Do

Passport to Manhood is designed for boys ages 8 to 17. Each Passport to Manhood session focuses on a specific aspect of manhood through weekly sessions. The program represents a targeted effort to engage young men in discussions and activities that reinforce character, leadership and positive behavior.

SMART Girls is a program for girls ages 8 to 18 which focuses on guiding girls to develop and adopt a healthy attitude and lifestyle. Girls learn to acquire and maintain a positive self-concept, positive peer relationships and sound decision-making skills.

SMART Moves is a health program made up of three groups: SMART kids for ages 6 to 9, Start SMART for ages 10 to 12, and Stay SMART for ages 13 to 15. Each program builds knowledge, attitudes and skills that increase healthy decision-making.

All-Star Sports Leagues are organized sports leagues for youth and teens engaging members in basketball, flag football and soccer. The goal of All-Stars is to provide all members with a fun way to build physical literacy as they participate on a sports team.

Triple Play is a dynamic wellness program demonstrating how to eat right, keep fit and form positive relationships to add to a healthy lifestyle. The Triple Play Program aims to improve Club Members' knowledge of healthy habits, increase the number of hours they participate in physical activities per day, and strengthen their ability to interact positively with others to form healthy relationships.



STEAM

Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Math



STEAM

Through our STEAM programs, Boys & Girls Clubs of Hartford are committed to closing the opportunity gap in science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics with innovative and creative programs and activities. After-school and summer learning environments provide unique opportunities to advance STEAM knowledge and increase interest in STEAM-related careers.

What We Do

DIY STEM is a hands-on, activity-based program for ages 9 to 12 that helps them connect scientific principles and real-world applications. DIY STEM includes five modules: Energy and Electricity, Intro to Aeronautics, Engineering Design, Food Chemistry, and the Science of Sports. Exposure to science, technology, engineering and math is critical during the tween years when Club members' natural curiosity drives interest and builds capacity for success in these disciplines.

My.Future provides access to various online digital programs that encourage youth to develop a range of knowledge, skills and behaviors required for success in the current and future workforce.

Lyricism 101 includes youth development practices and creative activities to build and expand the literacy skills of Club Members ages 14 to 18. The program recognizes the power of the literary arts – allowing teens to tell their stories, build community and express their artistic visions through the music of hip-hop and the culture of the cipher.

Imagemakers is a program that helps Club Members learn the art and science of photography in multiple categories, including culture and tradition, portraits, nature and surroundings, fashion and style, and editing and filter. Photographs are displayed at local and regional exhibits.

Drama Matters promotes a love of drama while increasing appreciation for the art form. Drama Matters builds self-confidence by inspiring creativity and improving academic achievement. Our program exposes Club Members to the theater and focuses on building new skills.

National Fine Arts Exhibit is a program that encourages artistic expression among Club members through drawing, painting, printmaking, collage, mixed media and sculpture. Club members' artwork is entered into an annual Boys & Girls Clubs contest.

Makerspace gives Members an opportunity to explore and learn how to use tools and materials to develop creative projects. Our members create with a 3D printer, explore robotics and learn how to use a laser cutter in the field of electronics.

Workforce Readiness



**WORKFORCE
READINESS**

The workforce landscape is undergoing a drastic change with technological innovations, the demand for new skills and adaptive work arrangements. Our programs help young people meet the workforce challenges of tomorrow by providing them with the safe space and positive mentorship necessary for success from their first-job to their dream career.

What We Do

Junior Staff is a small-group program that assists Club members, ages 13 to 18, in exploring a career in youth or human services, particularly Boys & Girls Clubs work.

Diplomas2Degrees is a college readiness program which guides Club members as they work toward high school graduation and prepares them for post-secondary education and career success.

Keystone Club is a unique leadership development experience that provides opportunities for young people, ages 14 to 18, to participate in activities in three focus areas: academic success, career preparation and community service.

Money Matters promotes financial responsibility and independence among Club members, ages 13 to 18. Participants learn how to manage a checking account, create a budget, save and invest, start a small business and pay for college.

Career Launch is a program that aids teens in identifying job requirements, seeking out financial aid and participating in career and job skills such as resume writing, interview preparation and job-seeking skills.

Realty Store extends the impact of Money Matters through an interactive game where teens visit a series of stations during an event and make different types of financial decisions – such as using a monthly salary to balance housing, groceries, transportation, and more.

College Tours expose teens to higher education and enhance access to college. The aim is to level the playing field for club members – many of whom are first-generation students – through strategic partnerships with institutions of higher learning.

Sophie is now old enough for Keystone Club. She's focusing on academic success, career preparation and community service, all while become a leader in the Club.

Sophie is excited to be a Junior Staff this summer. Her mom is grateful for the meals and snacks her growing teenager is getting every day!

Age 16

Sophie is part of the SMART Girls program and is learning about healthy decision making, building self-esteem, and positive peer relationships.

Sophie attends Workforce Readiness meetings where she's getting help applying for college. She's also developing skills which she applies to her summer job!
